



Good to go! Sunol

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“Good to Go!” is a modular learning and action approach to prepare community members for evacuation from wildfire. The program builds upon existing locally accepted wildfire hazard reduction and emergency preparedness programs and outreach methods.

Diablo FireSafe Council (DFSC) is developing and testing Good to Go! with the communities of Sunol in Alameda County and Sleepy Hollow in Orinda, Contra Costa County. Partners include Diablo FireSafe Council, residents, fire agencies, emergency service agencies, local businesses, local service organizations, community organizations, and government partners.

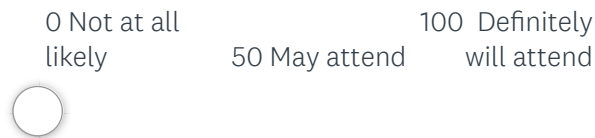
The program’s goal is to increase community evacuation readiness, and provide an action plan with activities to support wildfire preparedness and risk reduction.

3. Five Good to Go Sunol modules are under development. Check the modules you would most like to learn about.

☐ Module 1 - Getting Ready to Go! How to know when to go. Includes warnings, notifications, communications, situational awareness and lessons learned from recent wildfires. Four actions help you build a personal disaster plan for use when you need it.

☐ Module 2 - Set to go! What to take when you go. Prepares you for immediate evacuation or for when evacuation is a possibility. Also prepares you to shelter in place and for public safety power

shutoffs. Checklists provided to help you prioritize actions, dress for survival, lighten up your go bag and revitalize your Map Your Neighborhood group.

- ☐ Module 3 - Way to go! How to know which way to go. Details the evacuation process and what to expect, including: when to evacuate, where to go, what to do if faced with challenges. Checklists highlight best actions if driving out, sheltering or trapped.
- ☐ Module 4 - Everyone goes! Evacuating pets and large animals. Pet preparedness includes both small and large animals. Checklists by species are included for evacuation or if you have to leave your pet. First aid, after the wildfire, and lost and found pet checklists are also provided. Large animal preparation includes barn lists, checklists, special considerations for horses, and tips if you have to leave large animals behind.
- ☐ Module 5 - Going home! Tips for returning after a wildfire evacuation. Going home covers what to look for as you are returning home. Checklists highlight what to look for on the way, around your home, immediately outside and inside. Checklists also detail cleaning up, food safety and your pets.
